Below are the **3 required books** for the Community Herbalism Intensive (CHI) and the Weekend Herbal Program (WHP). The rest of the list includes a wide variety of books and websites that students may find useful. This is only a small smattering of what is available. Many states, regions, and parks have their own plant identification books and plant lists.

I suggest searching for used books online and in bookstores as good buys come and go quickly. While there are many places to find used books online, Amazon often has the best prices.

In the realm of field guides, editions are important. The newer editions are more up-to-date and easier to use. For books you are bringing into the field with you, a hardcover copy will generally last longer.

The Flora of Cortland and Onondaga Counties by Michael Hough (\$35) is a local technical field guide and covers the two counties just north of Ithaca. This makes it applicable to Ithaca as well.
